OUR TEAM

Intake Coordinator/Family Navigator will assist you in finding services that meet your needs.

Developmental Therapists will coach and mentor you and your child to gain skills and knowledge to enhance learning and growth.

Communication Assistants will coach and mentor you and your child to gain skills and knowledge in Speech and Language development.

Occupational Therapist and Speech and Language Pathologist will assess and make recommendations to help your child overcome challenges.

Developmental Support Services Manager will guide and support the team in a bi-cultural, trauma informed practice.

Administrative Assistant will provide office support to the Manager and team that is vital to the programs' efficient operations.



OUR SERVICES

Early Intervention program: Assists families and communities in key areas of prevention, intervention and education.

Individual/Family Therapy: Provides global screening of functioning, coordinates referrals and provides follow up on recommendations by professionals.

Occupational Therapy: Provides assessment and recommendations to children and families.

Speech and Language Therapy: Provides assessment and recommendations to children and families.

Visiting Grandparents Program: Enhances knowledge of traditional child development milestones and Anishinaabe language.

Respite Program: Offered to current clients of the program.
